Gross Motor

Understanding the World

-To develop an understanding of the wider world - England, Africa and Around the world.

-Comments and ask questions about aspects of the world, particularly, where they live e.g. clothes, religion, shops, transport etc.
-Discuss and compare differences between two places in the world e.g. England and Africa.
-Use of Videos - GoJettors (BBC Teach)
-RE – What can we learn from Stories?

Maths

-Number Blocks Series 2 - Two episodes per week.
-Composition of Number - How many 1's makes the number 4?
-Subitising - recognising numbers in different ways. Comparing Amounts - is it the same or different? How do you know?
-Number Bonds to 5 & beyond (Bus addition, fruit addition)
-1 Less (Introduction of Subtraction)
-Counting within 10 and beyond.
-Doubling

Expressive Arts and Design

-Focus skills - Collaging, modelling, painting, printing and weaving.
-Inspirational Art - Paul Kenton (Catch the night bus), Stone painting (Turkey - Evil Eye)
-Art Project - Aboriginal Art (Dot painting),
-Role Play –Airport - packing a suitcase, creating passports/tickets, money play, air hostess etc.
