Personal, Social and Emotional Development

We will be encouraging children to become more independent. During our dialogical book talk group. We will share the story 'No more nappies'. Children will be encouraged to look at the toilet and potty. Children will practise washing hands independently.

We will also support the children with their transition to the 3/4 year old classes (if they are moving up in September). They will get to know their new classroom and teachers.

We will talk about our feelings through stories and games. Talk about how to regulate own feelings, listening to the waves at the beach is calming.

We will talk about sun safety and how we can stay healthy in hot weather.

Working together to play team games – learning the rules, playing with others.

Turn taking – playing games, waiting for a turn, sharing toys with others.

Physical Development

Gross Motor Skills:

Weeks: 8

Kicking balls

Throwing and catching large balls into outstretched arms.

Climbing on play equipment.

Stamping, clapping and moving to music.

Fit themselves into spaces, like tunnels, dens and large boxes, and move around in them.

Sweeping / cleaning floors with big brushes

Fine Motor Skills:

Mark making on large pieces of paper – up and down, round and round. Squeezing lemons and limes. Cutting fruit with a knife.

Threading beads onto shoes laces. Use large and small motor skills to do things independently, for example manage buttons and zips, pulling up sleeves and pour drinks.
